UT president: It wasn't a protest. It was criminal trespassing. | Opinion

There is a long, proud history of protest at <u>The University of Texas at Austin.</u> I am grateful to work at a university where students, faculty and staff care deeply enough about community, national and world events to rally around those causes.

<u>Demonstrations play a role on campuses such as ours.</u> A university, after all, encourages students to discover and develop points of view, and to express them. These activities challenge the ways we think and feed a campus' dynamic atmosphere. UT students have held dozens of peaceful protests, largely without incident, throughout this academic year.

We also have a responsibility to keep the campus and its people safe, and to allow our teaching and research to continue. Our rules provide structure for this responsibility and set up conditions for the co-existence of protests, safety and education. We are

constantly reviewing those rules, improving on them, and making sure they protect everyone — those who are protesting and those who are learning, working or visiting campus. These rules also protect free speech, and enforcing them uniformly and consistently keeps us from discriminating against any particular point of view.


For decades, groups with an incredible array of differing views have shared a respect for our rules. These students, though <u>energized by a conflict or cause</u>, have nevertheless worked with us and found permissible ways to express themselves without putting others at risk.

Regrettably, protesters, including <u>many not affiliated with UT</u>, have refused in recent weeks to accept these rules and processes. It pains me deeply that even though the organizers declared their intent to break our rules, they rebuffed numerous attempts by our Office of the Dean of Students to meet beforehand. The on-campus encampments they said they would establish, and then did, were clearly prohibited by our rules, including a <u>prohibition against camping</u> that became effective in 2012. They also threatened to effectively disrupt the education of more than 52,000 students and to set an alarming precedent for anyone seeking to establish encampments in the future. Demonstrators were repeatedly urged, then ordered, to take down the encampments and disperse.

At every step, they refused. At that point, regardless of anyone's opinion, this was no longer a traditional assembly or protest. By the plain language of our rules, it was criminal trespassing.

Some have asked why Texas Department of Public Safety officers were on our campus during the protests. This is a fair question with a clear answer: They were protecting the safety of our campus community by assisting the University of Texas Police Department. Our police department is outstanding, but its size is limited. We knew — as did the demonstrators — that it was unlikely to be adequately staffed for what was coming.

We have watched with concern as disruptive and illegal encampments have sprung up on other university campuses, and we took seriously the pre-protest threats — voiced by organizers and others with no affiliation with UT — to "occupy" our own. As university leaders, we recognized that at other schools, encampments have preceded further and more serious disruptions, safety risks, injuries, and ultimately, more severe and dangerous police intervention. Also, if we allowed encampments in this instance, it would be nearly impossible to stop encampments from other groups in the future without facing challenges of chilling speech or viewpoint discrimination.



It is difficult — for all of us — to see serious police presence and arrests on our campus. It is worse, though, to see a handful of people flout rules meant to protect everyone. It is worse still to see that disorder escalate from encampments to occupations, as has happened at Columbia University and UCLA. And it is terrifying to contemplate where such occupations might end — and who might get hurt.

We share the sincere and deep concerns of many Longhorns about the lives lost in Gaza and Israel. Their human reactions — and their need to express them in hope of a better world — show the importance of our traditions of protest and assembly. Still, UT is a community. Our foremost responsibility has always been to keep that community safe.

We want to work with protesters — within our rules and laws — so they can express themselves. We need them to work with us to fulfill the responsibility we share.

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



Good afternoon! On behalf of Student Government, we would like to discuss the events that took place yesterday.

Yesterday, on May 1st, 2024, UT Dallas students and community members gathered in the Chess Plaza for a peaceful encampment protesting the genocide in Gaza. At approximately 4:00pm, around 50 state troopers arrived at the encampment in riot gear, threatening students to immediately disperse on the grounds of trespassing. In an incredibly short period of time from the arrival of the state troopers and announcement that students could not even stand in the Chess Plaza area, troopers threatened violence against students and belongings, and confiscated and destroyed cases of water, food, and student's personal possessions. After the encampment was torn down, troopers formed a barrier disallowing students to stand and protest in the Chess Plaza, instead forcing them to the fringes of the square and into the walkways by the magnolia trees. We understand the encampment was a violation of UTD and UT System policies. However, there should be no issues with students standing for solidarity, distributing food, or tabling with educational materials. Yet, even after shutting down the encampment, troopers violently destroyed these materials and distressingly threatened peaceful protesters to move off the Chess Plaza on the grounds of "trespassing", and some of these officers were laughing at and mocking protesters.

As the representative body for student voices, Student Government is deeply concerned about the rights of students to gather and peacefully protest.

"UT Dallas requested assistance from outside law enforcement in an effort to ensure the safety of our students, faculty and staff. Individuals may peacefully assemble in the common outdoor areas of campus to exercise their right to free speech, but they may not construct an encampment or block pathways," the school said in a statement. As we unfortunately witnessed yesterday, the law enforcement requested was not there to merely remove the encampment. There was no violence or rioting before their arrival, and there was no reason for police to destroy so much property and aggressively threaten peaceful protesters to evacuate the Chess Plaza. These actions served to instill fear in the student body and create a greater obstruction for those needing to move past the area, endangering students' wellbeing. President Benson spoke at the Academic Council meeting earlier that day stating "we certainly want to prevent escalation;" this sentiment was not on display yesterday. One of our own professors was arrested and escorted off the premises in chains. The level of militarism in response to a peaceful protest is unconducive to the safe environment we seek to maintain at UTD. We ask for clear and transparent communication to Student Government regarding why outside law enforcement was called and what the orders were to warrant such an unnecessarily violence dispelling of protesters.

Additionally, UEMR Leadership <u>announced</u> on Wednesday morning that they were restricting student EMT's ability to participate in or engage in planning on-campus protests. We are concerned about the legalities and implications of this rule. UEMR medics are

student volunteers and not employees of the University, and nowhere in their most recent version of UEMR's Standard Operating Procedures does it include conditions restricting free speech rights outside of working hours.

We do not see an appropriate justification for banning students from merely being involved in protest planning or action, especially if their protest conduct follows regulations set by UTD. It is imperative our university allows free speech and does not place baseless restrictions on students who serve our community in so many ways. We request that the administration swiftly address and clarify this issue with UEMR leadership and reaffirm the students' rights to free speech and expression.

We appreciate your collaboration and commitment to listening to student voices. While this is a difficult and stressful time for many of us, it is important that we prioritize open communication from all parties so that we can serve our campus and students as best as possible. We look forward to your response.



Dear President Richard C. Benson,

I am writing to express my deep concern regarding the recent treatment of students at your university who have been courageously speaking out against war and genocide in Gaza.

We are witnessing one of the worst humanitarian crises of our time. More than 34,000 Palestinians have been killed by Israel.

Across the United States, a new generation of student activists are rising up to demand an end to the bloodshed in Gaza. From coast to coast, these courageous young people are putting their bodies on the line to call for a ceasefire and a just resolution to the conflict.

This bill effectively burns the first amendment and I hope that Supreme Court steps in to throw this abomination away. This is disgusting as an American citizen. The censorship to speech will not stop here if this is allowed. Hate speech is protected under the first amendment. College students weren't spreading hate. We are trying to stop a GENOCIDE. We are tired of seeing babies, children, women and men being bombed by genocidal maniacs! Israel's genocide campaign has escalated to alarming levels, murdering over 40,000 Palestinians, including 15,000 children, 685 healthcare professionals and 125 journalists, since October 7th (Euromedmonitor.org).

Azadi/Azadi simply means freedom and Liberation. Intifada means to "shake off." When applied to Palestinians, it is an uprising against occupation. It isn't antisemitic to use these Arabic words. The phrase "From the river to the sea, Palestine will be free" is also not antisemitic. We are calling for the liberation of the Palestinian people from occupation, genocide, and apartheid. If we fail to stand up for the rights of these courageous student activists, we risk losing more than just a single battle. We risk losing our humanity and our ability to build a better future for everyone.

I call on you to stand with students protesting for peace and do everything in your power to establish a permanent ceasefire now.

Today has been a difficult day for students, staff and faculty at The University of Texas at Dallas. Before sunrise, a few dozen demonstrators set up an encampment in the Chess Plaza area of the Margaret McDermott Mall, blocked sidewalks and impeded pedestrian traffic.

Our University has been, and will continue to be, a strong advocate for the constitutional right to free speech. Several peaceful protests have been held on campus in the past weeks, and University rules and regulations were followed. The event today, however, violated institutional rules governing speech, expression and assembly, which prohibit tents,

barricades and other structures.

The UTD Police Department, with the assistance of other area law enforcement agencies, removed the encampment and made arrests after protesters were given a final, written warning to remove their encampment.

Our dean of students will continue to talk with student groups to ensure they know the rules and guidelines for protests. UT Dallas will continue to take the necessary steps to ensure that our campus remains safe and can function without interruption.







- Engaging in expressive activity within 10 feet of the entry and perimeter of all University buildings.
- Freedom of expression and assembly must allow teaching, research, administration, or other authorized activities on the campus.
- Freedom of expression and assembly must allow free and unimpeded flow of pedestrian or vehicular traffic on the campus.
- Possession, use, or display of firearms, facsimile firearms, ammunition, explosives, or other items that could be used as weapons, including but not limited to sticks, poles, clubs, swords, shields, or rigid signs that can be used as a shield.
- Signs on sticks or poles or otherwise attached to any device are prohibited. Holding signs that have "stake" type bases to them, nor can one carry the equivalent of a lawn sign. Anything that could be used as a weapon is not allowed.
- No open flames
- Causing a "disruption" to the business and/or academic mission of the university. This would be marching into an academic building and being loud enough to interrupt a class going on or marching into an administrative building and interfering with the business of any office suite.
- While crude and foul language, even offensive language, is not against policy, a protestor cannot incite a riot/violence/unlawful action. For instance, one cannot yell to the group, "We're going to go find a member of university leadership and make them listen to us!" that would imply an imminent threat to safety and, given the context, would not just be an utterance of a phrase without intent.

- Engaging in expressive activity within 10 feet of the entry and perimeter of all University buildings.
- Freedom of expression and assembly must allow teaching, research, administration, or other authorized activities on the campus.
- Freedom of expression and assembly must allow free and unimpeded flow of pedestrian or vehicular traffic on the campus.
- Possession, use, or display of firearms, facsimile firearms, ammunition, explosives, or other items that could be used as weapons, including but not limited to sticks, poles, clubs, swords, shields, or rigid signs that can be used as a shield.
- Signs on sticks or poles or otherwise attached to any device are prohibited. Holding signs that have "stake" type bases to them, nor can one carry the equivalent of a lawn sign. Anything that could be used as a weapon is not allowed.
- No open flames
- Causing a "disruption" to the business and/or academic mission of the university. This would be marching into an academic building and being loud enough to interrupt a class going on or marching into an administrative building and interfering with the business of any office suite.



If you do not follow these conditions until the case is fully resolved, you may face significant consequences.

A warrant may be issued for you to be re-arrested and brought before the magistrate or court for a hearing. You may be ordered to post additional bail or follow additional conditions, or your bail may be revoked, meaning you will be detained in jail until your trial, which could take several months. Your bail may be forfeited, meaning you will have to pay the full amount of your bail as a penalty for not following the conditions of your release. If you have a bail bond company, they may sue you to recover this amount, and your assets could be seized and sold to satisfy that debt.




 The 2 students are very organized and have written out everything they want to discuss. They are not sharing the document with others until after the meeting.

These are potential items they mentioned for the meeting:

- Where is the University with it's definition of antisemitism?
- What is the University doing to keep us safe?
- How is UTD going to address this antisemitic culture on campus? (I did say this a
 national issue we cannot solve the problem, but we can support our students and
 provide resources to help them achieve their goals for example in educating the
 community and promoting safety).
- They have some examples of things that have happened to them on campus in the last year they chose not to report. We have encouraged them to report, but they do not have specific names, pictures, dates, or times.
- They have recorded examples of things said yesterday they feel violated the new order and want to know what will be done to hold them accountable.
 - o "Intifada Intifada, Globalize the intifada, Long live the intifada."
 - Wave of terrorists' attacks in Israel against the Jewish community;
 keep these going
 - o "We are the intifada"
 - We are the killers
 - o "There is only one solution intifada revolution"
 - The only solution is to kill Jews
- They have definitions of words being used in the "rhetoric" they want to share.
- They are very concerned about the misinformation being spread on campus by the student group and faculty in classes (I have asked them for examples/names of faculty, and they do not have any to share at this time).
- Why has the graffiti not been removed? (This was the first I heard of it, and it has been reported).
- They want administration to help correct the misinformation this group is spreading about Israel and the conflict.
- They would like the administration to acknowledge students are feeling uncomfortable and unsafe.

Good afternoon! On behalf of Student Government, we would like to discuss the events that took place yesterday.

Yesterday, on May 1st, 2024, UT Dallas students and community members gathered in the Chess Plaza for a peaceful encampment protesting the genocide in Gaza. At approximately 4:00pm, around 50 state troopers arrived at the encampment in riot gear, threatening students to immediately disperse on the grounds of trespassing. In an incredibly short period of time from the arrival of the state troopers and announcement that students could not even stand in the Chess Plaza area, troopers threatened violence against students and belongings, and confiscated and destroyed cases of water, food, and student's personal possessions. After the encampment was torn down, troopers formed a barrier disallowing students to stand and protest in the Chess Plaza, instead forcing them to the fringes of the square and into the walkways by the magnolia trees. We understand the encampment was a violation of UTD and UT System policies. However, there should be no issues with students standing for solidarity, distributing food, or tabling with educational materials. Yet, even after shutting down the encampment, troopers violently destroyed these materials and distressingly threatened peaceful protesters to move off the Chess Plaza on the grounds of "trespassing", and some of these officers were laughing at and mocking protesters.

As the representative body for student voices, Student Government is deeply concerned about the rights of students to gather and peacefully protest.

"UT Dallas requested assistance from outside law enforcement in an effort to ensure the safety of our students, faculty and staff. Individuals may peacefully assemble in the common outdoor areas of campus to exercise their right to free speech, but they may not construct an encampment or block pathways," the school said in a statement. As we unfortunately witnessed yesterday, the law enforcement requested was not there to merely remove the encampment. There was no violence or rioting before their arrival, and there was no reason for police to destroy so much property and aggressively threaten peaceful protesters to evacuate the Chess Plaza. These actions served to instill fear in the student body and create a greater obstruction for those needing to move past the area, endangering students' wellbeing. President Benson spoke at the Academic Council meeting earlier that day stating "we certainly want to prevent escalation;" this sentiment was not on display yesterday. One of our own professors was arrested and escorted off the premises in chains. The level of militarism in response to a peaceful protest is unconducive to the safe environment we seek to maintain at UTD. We ask for clear and transparent communication to Student Government regarding why outside law enforcement was called and what the orders were to warrant such an unnecessarily violence dispelling of protesters.

Additionally, UEMR Leadership <u>announced</u> on Wednesday morning that they were restricting student EMT's ability to participate in or engage in planning on-campus protests. We are concerned about the legalities and implications of this rule. UEMR medics are student volunteers and not employees of the University, and nowhere in their most recent version of UEMR's Standard Operating Procedures does it include conditions restricting free speech rights outside of working hours.

We do not see an appropriate justification for banning students from merely being involved in protest planning or action, especially if their protest conduct follows regulations set by UTD. It is imperative our university allows free speech and does not place baseless restrictions on students who serve our community in so many ways. We request that the administration swiftly address and clarify this issue with UEMR leadership and reaffirm the students' rights to free speech and expression.

We appreciate your collaboration and commitment to listening to student voices. While this is a difficult and stressful time for many of us, it is important that we prioritize open communication from all parties so that we can serve our campus and students as best as possible. We look forward to your response.

Prohibited Conduct During Assemblies Under Policy UTDSP5001 – Speech Expression and Assembly:

- Engaging in expressive activity within 10 feet of the entry and perimeter of all University buildings.
- Freedom of expression and assembly must allow teaching, research, administration, or other authorized activities on the campus.
- Freedom of expression and assembly must allow free and unimpeded flow of pedestrian or vehicular traffic on the campus.
- Possession, use, or display of firearms, facsimile firearms, ammunition, explosives, or other items that could be used as weapons, including but not limited to sticks, poles, clubs, swords, shields, or rigid signs that can be used as a shield.
- Signs on sticks or poles or otherwise attached to any device are prohibited. Holding signs that have "stake" type bases to them, nor can one carry the equivalent of a lawn sign. Anything that could be used as a weapon is not allowed.
- No open flames
- Causing a "disruption" to the business and/or academic mission of the university. This would be marching into an academic building and being loud enough to interrupt a class going on or marching into an administrative building and interfering with the business of any office suite.
- While crude and foul language, even offensive language, is not against policy, a protestor cannot incite a riot/violence/unlawful action. For instance, one cannot yell to the group, "We're going to go find a member of university leadership and make them listen to us!" that would imply an imminent threat to safety and, given the context, would not just be an utterance of a phrase without intent.
- Erecting any type of temporary object or exhibit, anything physical in structure that would accompany said protest. This includes but is not limited to tents and barricades.
- Intentionally shielding one's face to evade identity; this would be different than a face covering typically associated with COVID-19/Cold protection or for religious/cultural requirements/reasons.
- Wearing of any type of body armor or helmet

These are potential items they mentioned for the meeting:

- Where is the University with it's definition of antisemitism?
- What is the University doing to keep us safe?
- How is UTD going to address this antisemitic culture on campus? (I did say this a
 national issue we cannot solve the problem, but we can support our students and
 provide resources to help them achieve their goals for example in educating the
 community and promoting safety).
- They have some examples of things that have happened to them on campus in the last year they chose not to report. We have encouraged them to report, but they do not have specific names, pictures, dates, or times.
- They have recorded examples of things said yesterday they feel violated the new order and want to know what will be done to hold them accountable.
 - o "Intifada Intifada, Globalize the intifada, Long live the intifada."
 - Wave of terrorists' attacks in Israel against the Jewish community;
 keep these going
 - o "We are the intifada"
 - We are the killers
 - o "There is only one solution intifada revolution"
 - The only solution is to kill Jews
- They have definitions of words being used in the "rhetoric" they want to share.
- They are very concerned about the misinformation being spread on campus by the student group and faculty in classes (I have asked them for examples/names of faculty, and they do not have any to share at this time).
- Why has the graffiti not been removed? (This was the first I heard of it, and it has been reported).
- They want administration to help correct the misinformation this group is spreading about Israel and the conflict.
- They would like the administration to acknowledge students are feeling uncomfortable and unsafe.

Subject: Student Government Inquiry to Yesterday's Events

Good afternoon! On behalf of Student Government, we would like to discuss the events that took place yesterday.

Yesterday, on May 1st, 2024, UT Dallas students and community members gathered in the Chess Plaza for a peaceful encampment protesting the genocide in Gaza. At approximately 4:00pm, around 50 state troopers arrived at the encampment in riot gear, threatening students to immediately disperse on the grounds of trespassing. In an incredibly short period of time from the arrival of the state troopers and announcement that students could not even stand in the Chess Plaza area, troopers threatened violence against students and belongings, and confiscated and destroyed cases of water, food, and student's personal possessions. After the encampment was torn down, troopers formed a barrier disallowing students to stand and protest in the Chess Plaza, instead forcing them to the fringes of the square and into the walkways by the magnolia trees. We understand the encampment was a violation of UTD and UT System policies. However, there should be no issues with students standing for solidarity, distributing food, or tabling with educational materials. Yet, even after shutting down the encampment, troopers violently destroyed these materials and distressingly threatened peaceful protesters to move off the Chess Plaza on the grounds of "trespassing", and some of these officers were laughing at and mocking protesters.

As the representative body for student voices, Student Government is deeply concerned about the rights of students to gather and peacefully protest.

"UT Dallas requested assistance from outside law enforcement in an effort to ensure the safety of our students, faculty and staff. Individuals may peacefully assemble in the common outdoor areas of campus to exercise their right to free speech, but they may not construct an encampment or block pathways," the school said in a statement. As we unfortunately witnessed yesterday, the law enforcement requested was not there to merely remove the encampment. There was no violence or rioting before their arrival, and there was no reason for police to destroy so much property and aggressively threaten peaceful protesters to evacuate the Chess Plaza. These actions served to instill fear in the student body and create a greater obstruction for those needing to move past the area, endangering students' wellbeing. President Benson spoke at the Academic Council meeting earlier that day stating "we certainly want to prevent escalation;" this sentiment was not on display yesterday. One of our own professors was arrested and escorted off the premises in chains. The level of militarism in response to a peaceful protest is unconducive to the safe environment we seek to maintain at UTD. We ask for clear and transparent communication to Student Government regarding why outside law enforcement was called and what the orders were to warrant such an unnecessarily violence dispelling of protesters.

Additionally, UEMR Leadership <u>announced</u> on Wednesday morning that they were restricting student EMT's ability to participate in or engage in planning on-campus protests. We are concerned about the legalities and implications of this rule. UEMR medics are student volunteers and not employees of the University, and nowhere in their most recent version of UEMR's Standard Operating Procedures does it include conditions restricting free speech rights outside of working hours.

We do not see an appropriate justification for banning students from merely being involved in protest planning or action, especially if their protest conduct follows regulations set by UTD. It is imperative our university allows free speech and does not place baseless restrictions on students who serve our community in so many ways. We request that the administration swiftly address and clarify this issue with UEMR leadership and reaffirm the students' rights to free speech and expression.

We appreciate your collaboration and commitment to listening to student voices. While this is a difficult and stressful time for many of us, it is important that we prioritize open communication from all parties so that we can serve our campus and students as best as possible. We look forward to your response.

Thank you for your patience in this matter. I have copied our student leadership, Operations Manager and Chief of Police on this email.

First, I need to address information that the Mercury printed in a story on 5/1 that was inaccurate. https://utdmercury.com/comets-create-encampment-in-solidarity-with-gaza

"At 11:15 a.m. SJP shared a message from UTD Emergency Medical Services Director Sheila Elliott, in which she said that UEMR members "are prohibited from participating in any protest on campus." Elliott said if UEMR employees were found to be involved in protest planning, it would be considered "insubordination" and they would be ordered to cease immediately. At the time of publication, Elliott has not responded to requests for comment."

Please understand that UEMR members are not "employees." I am the only full-time employee of UEMR. The EMS Providers within UEMR are VOLUNTEERS and are licensed EMS providers with the state of Texas. As a licensed provider, they are required to uphold the following the Texas Administrative Code, or they can receive disciplinary action and/or lose their medical license:

I am the EMS Director for University Emergency Medical Response (UEMR), the licensed first responder organization at The University of Texas at Dallas (UTD). I would like to take this time to clarify and contextualize a message that I made on May 1st regarding our campus EMS providers refraining from participating in the protests on campus. This announcement was made on SLACK, which is University Emergency Medical Response's private internal communication system.

UEMR provides first responder services at UTD but is organized as an independent entity that is legally separate from UTD. As a state-licensed first responder organization (not a UTD student organization), our sole focus is promoting the health and welfare of the students, faculty, and all other individuals on the UTD campus. We treat all individuals, regardless of race, ethnicity or political stance. UEMR is 93 members strong, where we have been nationally recognized as an EMS Ready Campus, at the highest tier.

Our first responders are VOLUNTEERS, not employees. UEMR has no affiliation with or bias toward any political viewpoint. In the same message asking our EMS providers to refrain from participating in the protests on campus, I also notified our providers of the need to increase EMS coverage in the case of a large-scale medical emergency related to the demonstration on 5/1. In no instance did I instruct UEMR providers to abstain from providing care to protestors on campus.

In regard to my message about prohibiting providers from participating in the protests: this is not a result of the issue being protested. During any moments of protest or unrest on campus, UEMR providers have a responsibility to promote the safety and order of the individuals on campus. This preserves the ability of our members to respond as medical providers in cases of escalation.

Furthermore, UEMR has a civic responsibility as a state-licensed first responder organization to be viewed as unbiased so that anyone who is in need, is comfortable calling on our organization for help instead of identifying us as part of any side of a protest and then choosing not to seek help from us out of fear of bias.

UEMR is a unique EMS agency in that its providers are both students and emergency response personnel, resulting in us having a close working relationship with both the student body and response organizations that are a part of UTD (Police Department, Emergency Management, etc.).

With all this said, UEMR Volunteer licensed EMS Providers must maintain medical integrity and are prohibited from participating in protests on campus while ON DUTY and/or representing UEMR. I have also urged our EMS Providers to use professionalism and discretion in these matters.
